The Nursery Class during Term Time

Whilst every day is full of discovery in The Nursery Class, there is a structure to our day during term time. The full Nursery day is from 8.00am to 6.00pm. Children may attend The Nursery for morning or afternoon or full days. We believe in building academic foundations through play.

The Nursery Class topic-led curriculum changes termly and are based around education content set in a play-led context. We cover each area of Early Years learning, including science and

The Nursery Class

In The Nursery Class, we encourage our children to develop a love of learning, an inquisitive mind, a passion for creativity, and a respect for each other and the world around us. Children who are three on the 1st September, i.e. at the start of the academic year, are eligible to join The Nursery Class.

We offer the best in early years provision by providing two very different experiences in a child's time here. During term-time, the Nursery Class Teacher and Teaching Assistant engage with the children in play-led learning activities. In the School holidays, Manor Farm Holiday Club offer rural-based activities and countryside fun in the Wycliffe Pre-Prep building. Drop-off and pick-up is in the same place all year round.

Holiday Fun at Manor Farm

Manor Farm Holiday Club is open to all our pupils in the Prep School. It is a rural activity club and based in the Pre-Prep Department on the Wycliffe Prep School campus throughout the holiday period. It offers an incredible countryside fun experience from Monday to Friday, 8.00am to 5.30pm.

The professional, dedicated team are Ofsted registered and combine a passion for childcare

Reception is where the foundations of all learning are laid. Small class sizes mean we take an individualised approach, where teachers know your son or daughter's character as much as their learning style. This helps children grow in confidence as they learn to read, write and do maths. Each class has no more than 18 pupils, and at least two full-time members of staff.

The very best care of your child

Wraparound care is available from 8.00am to 6.00pm and is included within the fee. Breakfast Club opens at 8.00am, and hot breakfasts are available, so you can drop off your little one on your way to work. School finishes at 3.30pm, but there are activities every day, followed by afterschool care, which lasts until 6.00pm.

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Our activity sessions include Ballet, Tennis, Computer Club, Hockey, Football (boys and girls), Choir, French, Cooking, Board Games, and Arts and Crafts.

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We offer exceptional pastoral care for your son or daughter thanks to our small classes and a high pupil-teacher ratio, giving our teachers time to know and monitor each pupil individually. We learn and understand your child's quirks and personality.

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Teachers sit and eat meals with the children every day. 'Pioneering Spirit' outdoor adventures

Forest School is a natural space that children visit regularly to play and learn in the outdoors. Your child has the opportunity to use their creativity, initiative and imagination, and develop their knowledge of the natural world. This helps them to develop resilience, confidence, and to take supported risks. During Forest School sessions, children learn outdoor skills, such as how to build a shelter, rope work, and fire lighting, as well as learning about nature and our environment. Sessions are usually rounded off with a cup of hot chocolate while sitting around a campfire.
