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

# More about Wycliffe Prep School

Wycliffe Prep School has around 220 children in the Nursery, Pre-Prep and Prep School. Around 65 pupils, from the age of 7 are full-time Boarding pupils. All class sizes are 'perfectly formed' ensuring your child gets great support from our teachers.

Whilst the majority of our pupils are from the local area, we welcome International Boarding pupils each year from several countries, creating a global community where children make friends with those from a different background.

Our School is in the beautiful surroundings of the Cotswolds, in a small village, Stonehouse. We are just 90 minutes from London, and there is a direct train from Stonehouse Station to London Paddington.

We have a long-standing history of providing first-class education and care to our pupils. The vast majority of our pupils progress to our Senior School, located five minutes from the Prep School.

Boarding is available for pupils from the age of seven. The Boarding Houses are homely, with pupils sharing a dormitory with around three other children in their year group. Weekends are an opportunity to have fun and explore the local area and countryside.

We also offer flexible and ad-hoc Boarding\* which is popular with parents as it gives a great element of flexibility.

If your child needs Learning Support – we have a dedicated Learning Support Centre. We are accredited by CReSTeD as category DU for dyslexia. Our facilities provide your child with great spaces to learn in. Our library is well stocked with the latest reads, the Art Studio is simply an incredible space, and the Theatre provides all children the experience of performing on the stage.

# Welcome to our Nursery



## The Nursery Class

Whilst every day is different and full of discovery, there is a general structure and flow to the day during term time.

The full Nursery day is from 8.00am to 6.00pm with lunch at 12.00pm. You can, of course, bring your child to Nursery later, or collect your child earlier. This should be arranged with the Nursery Class teacher.

Wraparound care from 8.00am until 6.00pm is included in the fee\*.

You can collect your child straight after the afternoon activity or your child is welcome to stay in our supervised care provision until 6.00pm.

# Building Academic Foundations through Play

The Nursery Class sessions are based around educational context, set in a play-led context and environment. Special diets can be catered for, with recipes from around the world.

## Specialist Sports

## Weekly Swimming Lessons

Our heated indoor Swimming pool enables us to provide your child with a weekly Swimming lesson with a qualified coach.

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## Literacy and Mathematics Area

Our Literacy and Mathematics areas are available for children to explore throughout the day. We use a range of materials to promote Literacy and Mathematics in a fun and interesting way. We observe what your child likes to play with and adapt our approach accordingly.

## Forest School

Your child will have an opportunity to enjoy and learn from our own Forest School on a fortnightly basis with our specially trained Forest School leaders.

## Topic-led Sessions

Led by the Nursery Class teacher, your child will enjoy a topic-based curriculum which changes termly and focuses on learning through play. The fun-filled topic activities cover each area of learning, including Science and discovery, Language and Literacy, Mathematics, shapes and numbers, role play, and outdoor and indoor games.

We incorporate the Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum into the Nursery day. This includes the three prime aspects of learning: personal, social and emotional development, communication and physical development, and the four specific areas of learning: Literacy, Mathematics, understanding the world and the expressive arts.

We interweave these key developmental areas naturally within our topic learning and social interactions so that your child's curiosity and enthusiasm for learning is ignited, their capacity to learn is developed and we help them form positive relationships.



## Outdoor Learning and Play

Being outside gives your child a sense of freedom and is fantastic for their physical and mental development. Children who learn to play outdoors are more likely to have an appreciation of the environment, naturally develop social skills and by making their own discoveries gain greater independence.

In the Nursery Class, the children play and learn outside every day. Enriching children's daily experience We believe that your child's experience is deepened and enriched by taking part in daily extra-curricular activities.

The Nursery Class offers a wide variety of extra-curricular activities that are often carried out by specialist teachers who teach across the rest of the Prep School. This includes weekly Swimming for children in their pre-Reception year with a qualified coach, fortnightly Forest School sessions with a trained Forest School leader as well as Ballet.

Reception is where the foundations of all learning are laid. Small class sizes mean we take an individualised approach, where teachers know your child's characteristics as much as their learning style. This helps your child grow in confidence as they learn to read, write and do Maths.

From Reception to Year 2, your child will have weekly timetabled Art, Music, Drama, Swimming and Sports lessons. This gives your child an opportunity to explore and develop their creativity and learn new skills. With specialist teachers, your child will learn from teachers with a deep knowledge and passion for their subject, developing your child's interest and increasing their engagement.



## ‘Pioneering Spirit’ – Outdoor Adventures

Forest School is a natural space in the School grounds that your child will visit regularly to play and learn in the outdoors.

Your child will be encouraged to use their creativity, initiative and imagination, and develop their knowledge of the natural world. This helps them to develop resilience, confidence and to take supported risks.

During Forest School sessions, children learn outdoor skills, such as how to build a shelter, rope work and fire lighting, as well as learning about nature and our environment. Sessions are usually rounded off with a cup of hot chocolate while sitting around a campfire.



# Years 3 to 6



## Nurturing Well-rounded Pupils with a Broad Curriculum

In Years 3, 4, 5 and 6, English and Maths are taught every day and are a key focus throughout the three years. Computing, Modern Foreign Languages, Humanities, Science, Music, Art and Drama are taught weekly, and Games or PE is timetabled every day, except for Thursday when a separate activities programme takes place.


In Year 6, Saturday Morning School is introduced, 'Discovery programme', and continues throughout Years 7 and 8. Designed to enrich the curriculum, Saturday mornings are thematic sessions that we use to develop some of the critical skills pupils will need in later life.

## Sports for all Abilities

Sport is inclusive and children are encouraged to try new things, where their willingness to have a go is celebrated. The main sports are Hockey, Netball and Cricket for girls, and Rugby, Football and Cricket for boys. Pupils also enjoy Swimming in our indoor heated Swimming pool, Athletics, Tennis, Squash and Cross-Country.

We believe children need space to grow and be known as individuals. With our beautiful grounds and small class sizes (average of 18 per class), pupils thrive with the extensive individual attention they receive and the opportunity to explore their own interests and capabilities.





# Years 7 and 8

Pupils in our Years 7 and 8 experience a rewarding two years as they increase in self-confidence, develop their intellectual maturity, cultivate leadership skills and take greater responsibility for their learning. We encourage their interests, try new activities, develop their own sense of self and become more resilient.



## Safe, Purpose-built Environment

Year 7 and Year 8 are based in Etheridge Hall with first-class teaching facilities and their own Common Room, where they enjoy a large quantity of tea and toast at break times.

Classes of less than 20 ensure pupils have a highly personal learning experience and are working at the best of their ability.

Our broad and unique curriculum, known as the Encompass Programme, is taught by specialist teachers in outstanding facilities. Pupils learn three languages: French, German and Spanish as standard, to ensure they can confidently choose their language option in the future.

Our Discovery programme runs on a Saturday morning from 8.50am to 12.15pm and involves an invaluable enrichment programme with themed blocks of learning to develop some of the key skills that pupils need in later life. These include debating, how to research, working together as a team to problem solve and examining some of life's great questions.



## Embracing Leadership Responsibilities

During the last two years at Prep School, pupils will have the opportunity to take on roles of responsibility such as Sports Team Captaincy, Prefects or Heads of School. Year 8s are expected to accompany visitors on school tours and make conversation with them, this combined with being role models for their younger peers encourages maturity and independence.

# Making the Move to Senior School



Wycliffe Senior School teachers work alongside their Prep counterparts to ensure that the transition from Year 8 to Year 9 is smooth, as pupils learn a curriculum that seamlessly runs into Year 9.

We find that the nurturing Prep environment and smaller class sizes builds children's confidence, so that when they join the Senior School in Year 9, they are self-assured and ready for the move.

Embracing interests and developing a true sense of self, Years 7 and 8 offer the chance for children to grow up more gently and become an adolescent in a safe and trusted environment without being involved in the social and academic world of young adults and the pressures of exams.

Through our value-added educational programme in Drama, Music, Art and activity clubs, pupils can explore their interest and develop new passions. They have the opportunity to take leading roles in plays, choirs, teams, clubs and sporting activities if they desire. It is about discovering what makes them happy.





## A Seamless Transition

Progress from Year 8 at the Prep School to Year 9 in the Senior School is a seamless transition with no entrance exam required. Most of our pupils follow this path.

Scholarships are available at Year 9 and Year 12 in Academic, Art, Design Technology, Drama, Music and Sport (with Modern Foreign Languages and All-Rounder Awards at Year 12 as well) – presenting opportunities to recognise and celebrate our very talented pupils.

## GCSE Options

20 subjects are offered at GCSE including less common ones such as Business Studies and Japanese.

## A Level Options

In Year 12, pupils can choose from 27 options available across both A Levels and BTECs. They can also study the Extended Project Qualification, which is a research project of their own choosing and is highly regarded by universities.

## Careers Advice

We offer first-class careers advice, delivered by a bespoke Careers Team, from Year 9. Each pupil works through what they want to do (or not) ready for a world with ever-growing options.

## Clubs and Activities

With over 60 clubs and activities across the year, there is the opportunity to try something new or perfect an existing talent. Combined Cadet Force, Ten Tors and the Duke of Edinburgh's Award enable the Year 9s and upwards to explore the great outdoors, develop leadership skills and learn what it means to be part of a team.

# Boarding

Being part of the Wycliffe family, Boarding has always been a big part of life at Wycliffe Prep, and pupils genuinely feel that it is their second home.

Approximately 65 Boarders from Year 3 to Year 8 live in two Boarding Houses: Pennwood is home to 35 boys, and Windrush accommodates 30 girls. Most of the Boarders are from HM Forces' families with about 15 from other countries such as Spain, China and Italy.

Supper time is 5.30pm, and pupils eat in the Food Hall and then head 'home', over the bridge, for evening activities.

The majority of Boarders stay at the weekends and they can stay over Exeat Weekends for no extra charge. Flexi-boarding and occasional Boarding is very popular with our Day pupils. It can be invaluable for parents and if pupils have late activities at the College.

Every week, additional Day pupils join the Boarders, be it for one night or four. The Boarders make the most of the College's extensive sports facilities on their doorstep, enjoying Games on the all-weather pitch, Tennis Courts or going Swimming.

Prep (homework) is at set times in the evening so School work is always up to date. Weekends are also busy with activities organised by the Boarding House Parents, in consultation with pupils.

## What do the Boarders do?

Boarders use the School facilities including the Astro Turf, Tennis Courts and Swimming Pool. They have designated times for Prep (homework) so that their School work is always up to date. The Boarding House Parents (in consultation with boys and girls) organise activities at the weekend, such as bowling, trips to attractions, football, pizza and movie nights. Boarders celebrate their birthdays with parties where they can invite their Day and Boarding friends.

Bowling, football, pizza and movie nights are all popular. Important childhood events such as birthdays and the tooth fairy are all celebrated!

## Boarding Life

We take complete care of your son or daughter whilst they are at School – attending dentist and doctor appointments, ensuring teeth are clean, and taking care of laundry – just like you would at home!

## Keeping in Touch

You will always be able to contact your son or daughter (and vice versa). We have house-wide WiFi and they can video-call, text or call, but we restrict the amount of time pupils can access their devices and we have one day with no evening-technology!

# The Very Best Care of Your Child



## Food and Breakfast Club

Breakfast Club is an enjoyable start to the day. All children are welcome to start their day at Breakfast Club from 8.00am to 8.25am.

Breakfast Club is included in the fees and you are welcome to drop your child at School from 8.00am so that they can enjoy a hot breakfast with their friends.

Staff are on hand to ensure they eat well and are well-fuelled for a day of learning.

Meals are meticulously planned and nutritionally balanced. Children in the Nursery Class and Pre-Prep have a hot lunch every day between 12.00pm and 12.30pm.

The Nursery Class teacher and teaching assistant sit and eat their meals at the Nursery Class table with the children. This means that your child is eating well and healthily, they learn about the food, its origins and nutritional value, all while learning good table manners.

Pupils in Year 3 and upwards have a staggered lunch from 12.00pm onwards.

Our meals are freshly prepared on campus by our caterers. The chefs not only cook the dishes but also serve the meals personally to your child. They get to understand what they enjoy and encourage healthy and adventurous eating habits. They put on exciting themed lunches throughout the year which children love.

The recipes are creatively planned with controlled fat, salt and sugar content so that your child benefits from a healthy diet.


Dietary requirements are well catered for. Our caterers are extremely good at dealing with any individual dietary requirements that your child may have.

## Locally Sourced and Varied Produce

Food is sourced as locally as possible. We offer balanced meals including a choice of a hot cooked meat or vegetable dish with a selection of freshly cooked vegetables, potatoes, pasta or rice, a salad bar, jacket potatoes, freshly baked bread and a variety of puddings and fresh fruit.



# After-School Clubs



Wraparound care is available from 8.00am to 6.00pm and is included in the fee\*.

Our school's day varies based on the pupils' age groups, providing a structured and engaging environment for all. Pre-Prep pupils finish their academic day at 3.30pm and participate in activities until 4.30pm, after which they can join after-school care. For Prep pupils, the school day ends at 4.30pm, followed by a snack and additional academic prep or various extracurricular activities from 4.45pm to 5.30pm. The clubs listed are part of our Thursday afternoon Activities session, offering pupils from Years 3 to 8 the chance to choose their preferred activities on a half-term basis. After-school clubs usually focus on sports, fostering physical development and teamwork among participants.

Our activity sessions include Ballet, Tennis, Computer Club, Hockey, Football, Choir, French, Cooking, Board Games, and Arts and Crafts. We offer exceptional pastoral care for your child thanks to our small classes and a high pupil-teacher ratio, giving our teachers time to get to know and monitor each pupil individually.

# Embracing Global Citizenship

## We prepare our young people to succeed and find their passions in an increasingly globalised world.

At Wycliffe, we aim to do this by embracing the school vision of promoting a 'pioneering spirit' and encouraging individuals to embrace their future as global citizens. Cultural diversity is an important part of the Wycliffe experience and crucial to our pupils becoming true global citizens.

Some of our Prep Pupils are International, which allows us to share and learn from each other's cultures. At the same time, becoming a positive citizen of the world it is vital to understand our own environments and culture.

As a Round Square School, Wycliffe is part of Round Square's internationally diverse network of 200 like-minded schools in 50 countries on six continents. These schools inspire pupils to become future leaders and custodians of our planet and importantly share a commitment, beyond academic excellence in terms of personal development, responsibility and understanding through service, challenge and adventure.

We are developing a unique curriculum which includes facets of the six IDEALS or 'pillars' that make up the Round Square continuum (Internationalism, Democracy, Environmentalism, Adventure, Leadership and Service) and these align neatly with Wycliffe's values. They have provided an opportunity to work in collaboration with schools across the world and every pupil will take part in a Round Square collaboration every year.

## Pioneering Spirit

The concept of 'pioneering spirit' encompasses all that education is about – challenging yourself, working collaboratively, getting through really tough times and sometimes falling over, dusting yourself off and carrying on.

We promote a pioneering spirit by developing critical thinking, enhanced through opportunities in problem-solving and considering perspectives, all the while shaping a love of learning.



## Developing Rounded Individuals

The Wycliffe experience is more than what happens in the classroom. Wycliffe promotes a 'pioneering spirit' and helps pupils to achieve their spiritual, physical, creative as well as their academic potential in all areas of the School.

From Nursery to Year 2, children enjoy regular Forest School sessions, learning to play outdoors and, by making their own discoveries, gaining greater independence.

From Year 3, the Prep School explores expedition days when pupils engage in pursuits such as long-distance walks, cycling challenges and climbing. As pupils move through the School, we encourage every individual to take on a role supporting others in pastoral, Academic or sporting activities. Learning to be a responsible young adult that care for their community is part of a Wycliffe education





## A School with Pioneering Spirit and an Understanding of Military Families

For 140 years, Wycliffe has closely supported the families and children of those serving in the British Armed Forces.

We understand the challenges of military life and use our experience to support children of military families from around the world to settle quickly at school.

Wycliffe is a genuine global community welcoming International pupils from across the world. All our International Boarders are fully integrated into School life, sharing Houses and lessons with UK pupils and we provide excellent pastoral care and a programme of wellbeing activities to ensure your child is happy.

Your child will have plenty of opportunity to make friends and socialise through weekend events and evening activities. Today, 33% of our Boarders are from military families. Our founder, G.W. Sibly, chose to name the College after 14th century theologian John Wycliffe. His qualities of 'independence' and a 'pioneering spirit' reflected what G.W Sibly wanted to see in his staff and pupils. Seven centuries later, it is to Wycliffe that our key values of independence and pioneering spirit can be traced.

## Flexible Holiday Cover

We appreciate that childcare can be difficult to arrange, particularly in the School holidays. There is no minimum commitment with Atlas Camps. Camp hours for a standard day are 9.00am to 4.00pm; however, an extended day from 8.00am to 5.00pm can be selected. You just book individual days and times as required. It is simply one location with the same drop-off times throughout the year.

- 1. Get in contact** with our Prep Admissions Manager by email [prepadmissions@wycliffe.co.uk](mailto:prepadmissions@wycliffe.co.uk) or phone **01453 820471**. They will be able to answer your questions and talk you through the admissions process.
- 2. Come and see** us in person at an open event or for a personalised tour.
- 3. Register your child.** You can do this online at [wycliffe.co.uk/reg-form](http://wycliffe.co.uk/reg-form). At this stage, we will ask that you provide us with the latest two school reports for your child, if available. If your child has additional learning needs, we also ask for more information.
- 4. Meet the staff.** Depending on the age of your child, they will meet with the Head of Pre-Prep or Head of Prep.
- 5. Assessment/Time in School.** If your child will be joining Year 3 or above, they will be asked to do an online assessment, so that we can assess what level they are working at. We also ask (if possible) that your child joins us for a taster day. If they are going to be a Boarder, we ask (if possible) that they have a sleepover with us, so we can see how they settle.
- 6. Offer of a place.** Offer of a place. When we have the information that we need and you are happy to proceed, we shall offer a place. Generally, you will have four weeks to accept the place for your child. Confirmation of the place is once the offer has been accepted, joining forms have been completed and the deposit has been paid.
- 7. Stay in touch.** We will invite you and your child to a range of events so that you both feel part of the School before you join us.
